Finished in 1898, the Campanile was originally a memorial from Edgar W. Stanton to honor his wife Margaret after her passing. Originally having only 10 bells, that number has since expanded by 40 to a grand total of 50 bells to make a musical instrument called the carillon.

There are 20-minute concerts starting at 11:40 a.m. every day classes are in session.

The Campanile is host to a campus tradition called Campaniling, where students kiss under the campanile at the stroke of midnight. During homecoming, thousands of students come together for mass Campaniling, accompanied by fireworks and even pancakes.
